Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank sends hurricane disaster relief to Louisiana

Friday, September 17 is Hunger Action Day – a day where efforts across the country are focused for greater hunger-fighting impact. It also happens that on this day, Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank (The Food Bank) is preparing to send almost 25,000 pounds of food and water to the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank as the area experiences continued flooding from the remnants of Hurricane Nicholas.

Working in partnership with with Feeding America and the Brothers' Brother Foundation, the Food Bank shipment includes 20 pallets of water, non-perishable food and MREs (meals ready-to-eat). Brother's Brother Foundation is arranging for delivery of the food on Monday.
